

## Continued Partnership with the Legal Resource Centre Benefits Albertans



The Laws for Tenants and Landlords, available at [www.landlordandtenant.org](http://www.landlordandtenant.org), makes residential tenancy information accessible, understandable and comprehensive. The website is the result of an Alberta Real Estate Foundation grant from 2006 to fund an extensive project with the Legal Studies

Program to make such information available to consumers.

The Foundation has extended its investment in the important work of the Residential Tenancies Legal Information Program until 2012. Funds will be directed towards broadening the scope of materials on landlord and tenant information available to consumers in the areas of condominiums, low income housing and housing options for seniors.

The continued partnership fulfills one of the Foundation's primary mandates of consumer education. The website is the result of effective collaboration between the provincial government, the non-profit sector and individual Albertans. The information is Alberta specific and breaks down the barriers of legalese for understanding by both landlords and tenants.
